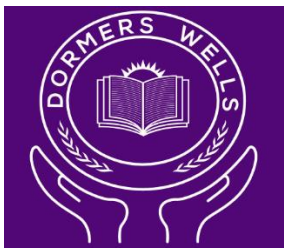
## PE and Sports Premium 2020-21

### PE and Sports Funding

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2020 to 2021 to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - will be allocated to primary school Head teachers. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on providing PE and sport in schools

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## How Dormers Wells Primary School will be Focusing the funding

### **PE Specialist**

PE teaching is a specialist role it is essential to implementation strategy of the school. We believe that all children should given every chance of accessing sporting expertise, which will help to develop positive experiences of physical activity.

Our PE specialist has elevated the skill and confidence of all staff in teaching PE as he has guided and supported them with observation, delivery through demonstration, partner teaching and planning. As a consequence of this, we have extended the range of sport and exercise to help nurture a children to be physically astute.

### **Impact of a specialist PE teacher**

We have extracurricular clubs out of school time to support the more in-depth learning. The impacts of these sessions have been evident, with a significant number of pupils participating and joining local sporting organisations to continue their experience.

### **Joining the Featherstone School Sports Partnership**

A member of the SSP supported the school in implementing virtual and Hybrid competitions/festivals when the Covid pandemic stopped school events. The partnership also develops staff teaching, monitors child progress, evaluates the schools' use of government funding, and plans targets to succeed this academic year. This allows staff access to key training and development opportunities.

### **Curriculum enrichment and broad offer**

This year, we will continue working with Brentford CST to upskill year 5 children in Physical activity and PSHE. We also had the coach from London Broncos to continue rugby into our curriculum activities.

### **How will parents know it is working?**

We keep records of the number of sports we have represented Ealing at the School Games Mark. We have created clear pathways with many of our pupils being invited to play for local football team Inventive Football Academy or London Tigers FC.
